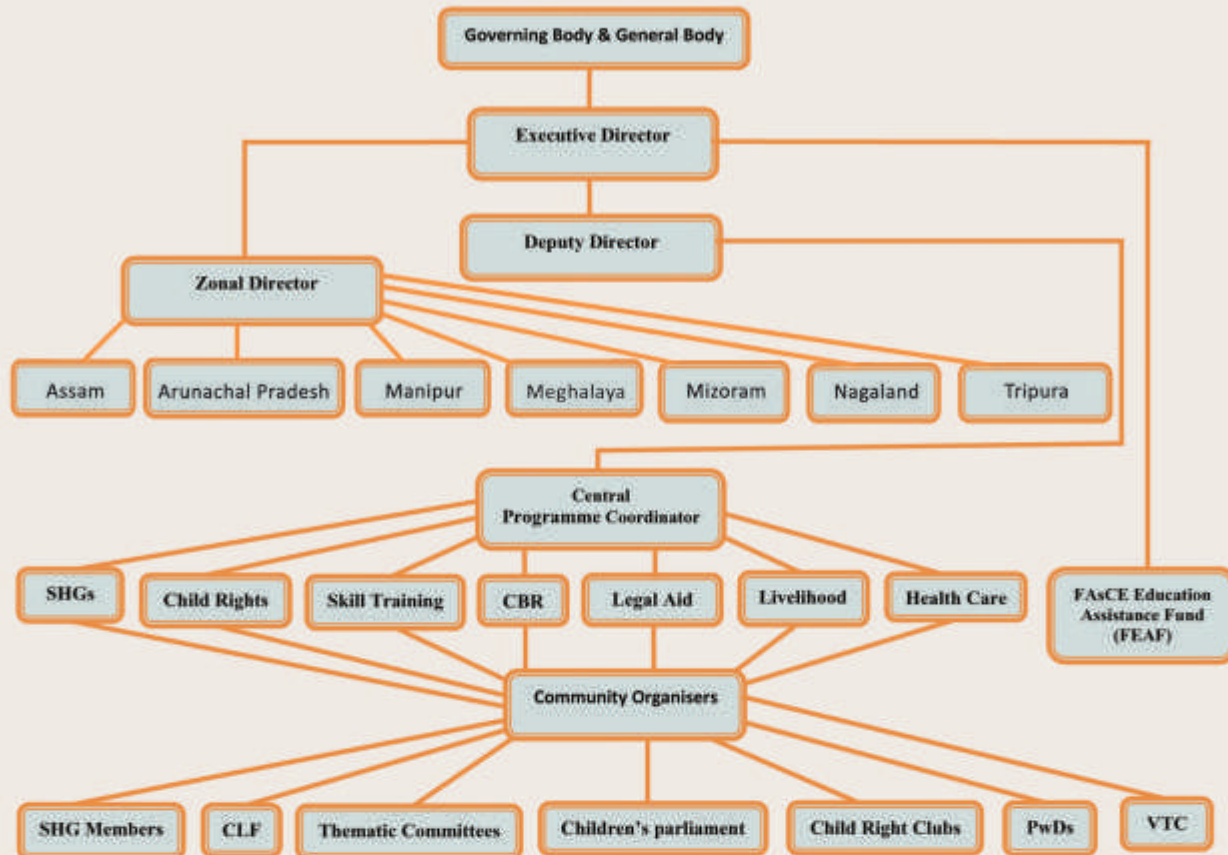

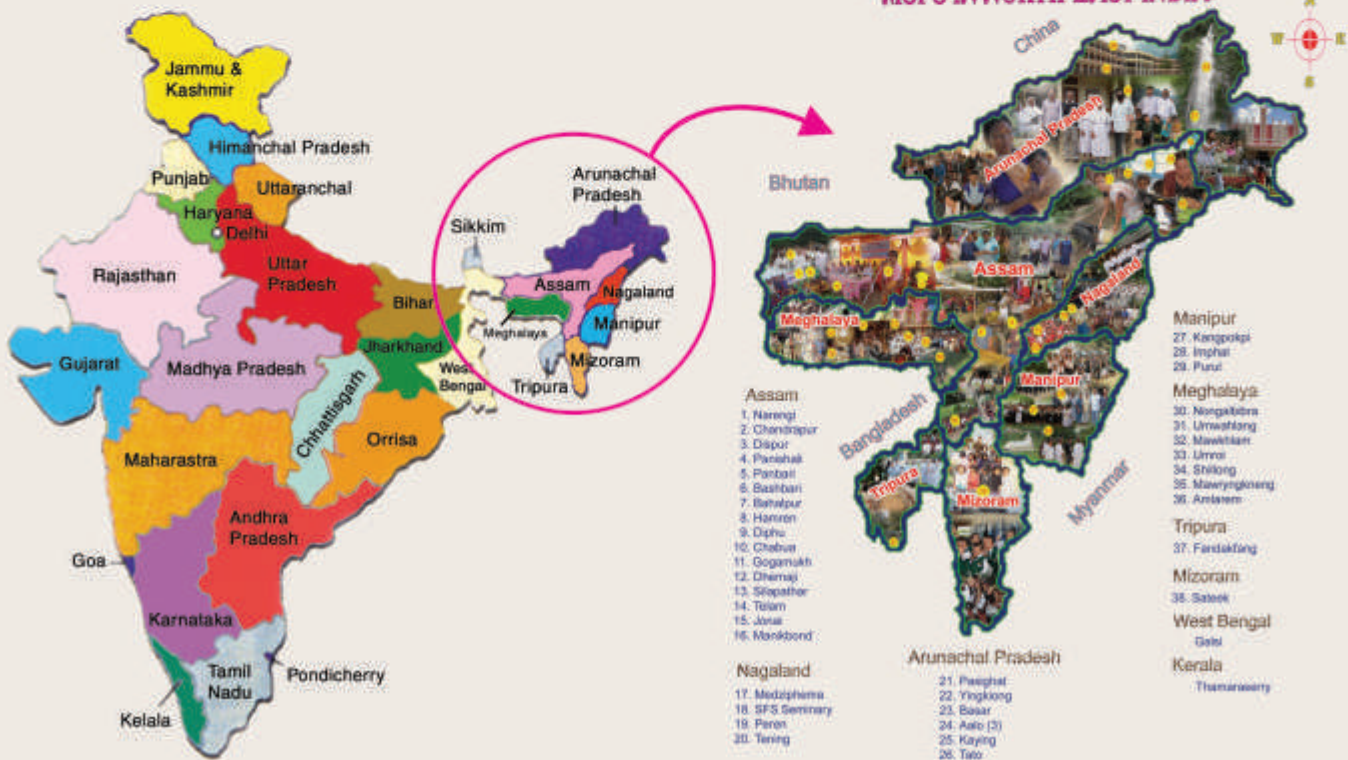

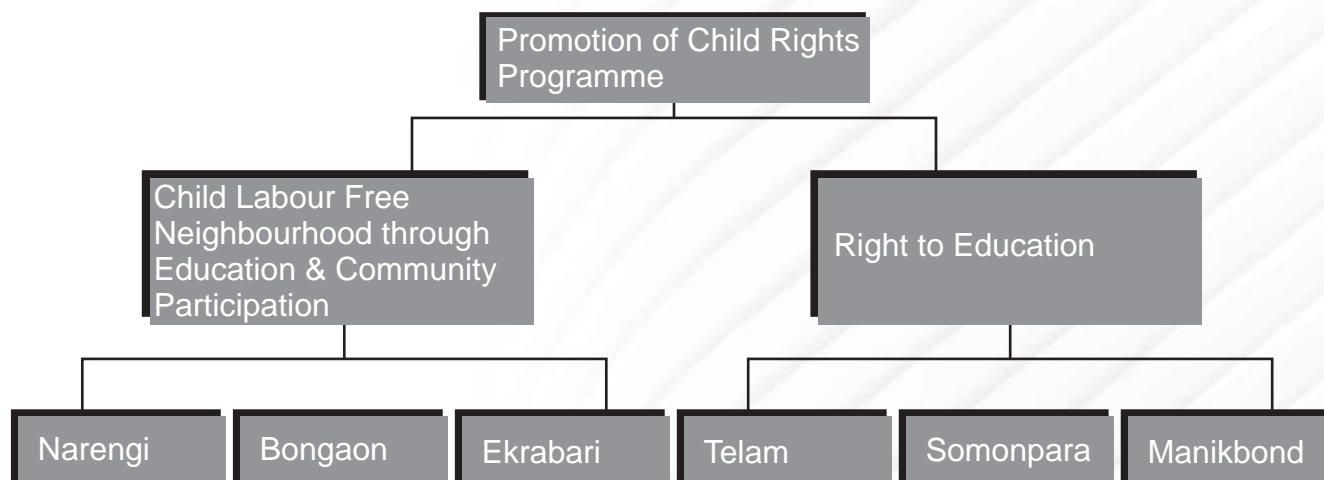
ACCOMPLISHMENTS AND ACHIEVEMENTS DURING 2019-2020



The financial year 2019-2020 for Fransalian Agency for Social Care and Education (FAsCE India) has been a year of varied activities and programmes from the different projects implemented in our project areas across Northeast India. Through its Integrated Community Development Programmes, Promotion of Child Rights, Community Based Rehabilitation for Persons with Disabilities, Promotion of Health and Protection of Environment projects and programmes, the organization was able to achieve its goal. The timely interventions, capacity building programmes and hand-holding support to our beneficiaries are the key factors to our journey of promoting progress in the lives of the poor and marginalized children, youth, women and men. This annual report highlights our major activities undertaken during the review period in collaboration with various agencies, local partners and efficient project teams.

1. PROMOTION OF CHILD RIGHTS

Child Rights is one of the priority areas of FAsCE India in its multi-pronged strategies promoting, protecting and realizing to raise awareness and to overcome the barriers preventing children from enjoying their rights of clean and healthy environment, to education, to protection (from child labour, child marriage and child trafficking) and avail opportunity to participation. During this period some of the major activities carried out in line with the above mentioned strategies through our various programmes and project activities.

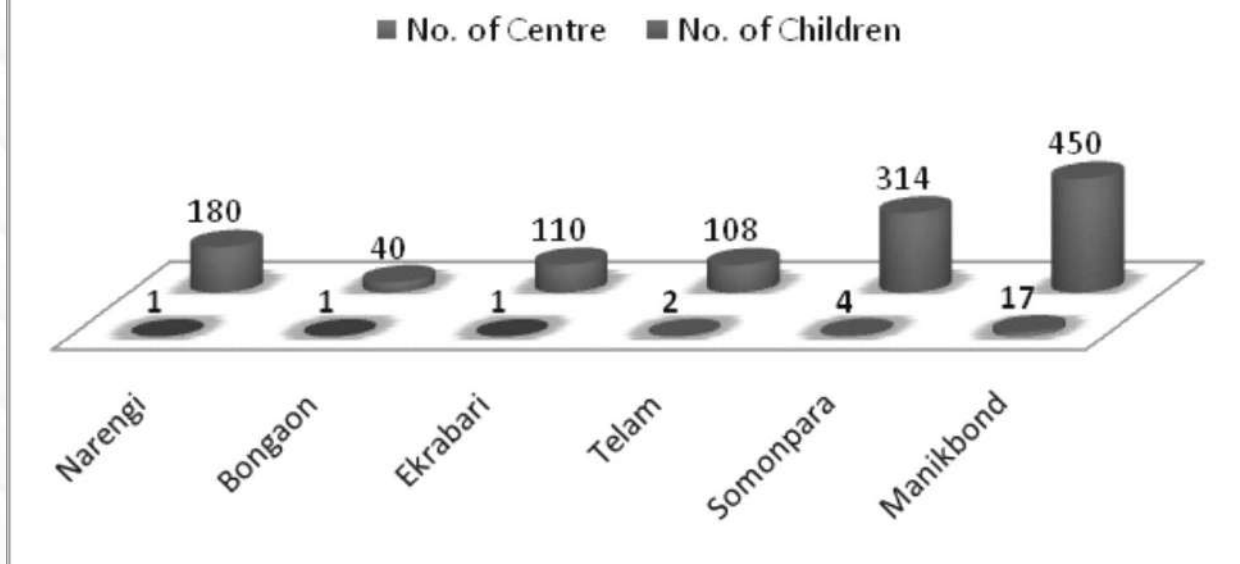


1.1 Child Labour Free Neighbourhood through Education and Community Participation

The project "Child Labour Free Neighbourhood through Education and Community Participation" initiated in April 2015 by Fransalian Agency for Social Care and Education i in Narengi. Regular tuition classes are held in the Supplementary Education Centres in Narengi, Bongaon, and Ekrabari. The beneficiaries are poor and marginalized children from urban slums and suburb communities. With the objective - To empower children with a meaningful educational support; To ensure 100% retention and completion of secondary level of their school education; and To encourage community participatory process to ensure right to education and eradication of child labour and child marriage.

1.2 Right to Education ensuring educational right to the children of rural areas through Supplementary Education Programme

The aim of this programme is to foster enabling educational environment and remedial intervention for school-going children in rural areas by providing free tuitions and co-curricular activities for motivation and all-round development. Owing to various factors at the rural settings education is often seen taking the back seat. The aim of these centres is to spread awareness on schooling and educational pursuit. The centre apart from imparting and assisting children in their studies to better their academic performances it also helps in bridging the gap better the school teachers and parents.

Major Activities during the review period 2019-20

- * **Inauguration of Four Supplementary Education Centres:** Four new Supplementary Education centres were opened on May 08, 2019 in four villages: Somonpara, Boldamgre, Gambegre and Dabellagre. There are a total of 314 students enrolled from English and Garo medium especially from Govt. schools availing the remedial classes.





- * **Skit on Social Issues at Supplementary Education Centre** was held on April 11, 2019 at the premises of SFS School, Narengi. Parents were invited; they joined their children for the sensitization programme. The topics were on normalization of menstruation, eve-teasing, aim of life, household clashes and gender bias. Relevant for parents to understand their impact on children. The animators' team was the MSW Interns from TISS. Around 300 children and parents attended the programme.
- * **World Day against Child Labour** was observed on June 12, 2019 at Narengi. An animation programme was organised on the theme "Children's shouldn't work in fields but on dreams". Mr. Ranjan Baruah, CEO Founder of North East Youth Foundation was the resource-person. The sessions laid emphasis on childhood as a time to aspire, dream and to pursue education. 140 children from higher and middle sections of the centre participated in the programme.



- * **Summer camps** were held at Narengi, Bongaon and Ekrahari Supplementary Education Centres during the month of July 2019. 330 children from these centres participated in the summer camp. The activities included workshops on literary and drama, games and art & craft activities.



- * **Session on Theatre** was held for children, the effect of drama on language, perspective-taking and imagination contribute to academic and all-round development of a child. The session held for the Narengi centre was conducted by Mr. Arup Jyoti Rabha, Director of Education in Theatre, Guwahati. 55 selected children from middle and higher sections participated in the session.



- * **Comprehensive Medical Camp:** A comprehensive Medical Camp for children of Narengi centre was held at Narengi. The team of doctors from Project CHILD (Child Health Intellectual and Lifestyle Development) conducted the medical check-up and updated health cards of every individual child. Health check-up was availed to 200 children.



- * **Seminar on Non-Violence:** A seminar on Non-Violence was organized to mark Gandhi Jayanti on October 02, 2019 for the children of Supplementary Education Centre, Narengi. The resource person Mr. Ranjan Baruah portrayed why Gandhiji choose to follow the path of Ahimsa or Non-Violence. The children then interacted and exchanged their concept, views and notions on Ahimsa and Non-violence.



* **Awareness Skit on Mobile Phone Use:**

An awareness skit was held on November 07, 2019 on the use of mobile phone among 200 children and their parents. The skit was presented with narration and pictorial depiction for making it meaningful and interesting to the children and their parents and bringing home the advantage and disadvantage of the use of mobile. Fr. Benoy Illickal was the Chief Guest of the day.



* **Children's Day** was celebrated from November 14, 2019 at centre and community level in a week-long celebration by the FAsCE India team. 914 children participated in variety cultural programmes, various competitions were held and winners were awarded prizes. At the centre level the programme was held in Somonpara, Narengi, Ekra Bari and Bongaon and at community level it was held in Hatishila and Amsing Jorabat.



* **Awareness Programme in the Supplementary Education Centres on COVID-19:** In the wake of COVID-19 pandemic, an awareness was held at Narengi on March 13, Ekrabari on March 14 and at Bongaon on March 16, 2020 reaching out to 350 children. The Supplementary Centre Coordinator and volunteers from the Narengi Supplementary Education Centre gave awareness on the novel coronavirus - COVID 19, precautionary measures were explained and face masks and sanitizers were distributed to all the participants.



2. INTERGRATED RURAL DEVELOPMENT AND WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

Along with the on-going projects of women Self Help Groups and Prevention on Gender-based Violence against women and girl children during this annual reporting period two major developmental projects were implemented in Assam and Meghalaya supported by Manos Unidas and MISEREOR. The integrated rural development and women empowerment is not just for meeting the economic needs but also achieve holistic social development at the five levels of empowerment - organization, education, health, saving & credit and income generation. There has been a positive change in the attitude and life perspective of beneficiaries.

2.1 FAsCE India Self Help Group and Federation Programme at Narengi

Since 2013 FAsCE India has been facilitating women Self Help Groups in Narengi. FAsCE India has provided them with hand-holding support to become eligible for schemes and programmes under NRLM - Block and NULM - Guwahati Municipality Corporation. Various training and awareness programmes during this review period for these Self Help Groups facilitated and organized by FAsCE India to empower them to become aware of their rights, economic processes that can work in their favour to improve their livelihood activities.



2.2 Formation and Strengthening of Self Help Groups for Improved Livelihood - Somonpara, West Garo Hills District, Meghalaya

The second phase of the project was initiated in February 2019 to promoting sustainable and improved socio-economic, education, health and living conditions of the people of Somonpara. The project is being supported by MISEREOR Hilfswerk, Germany. The implementation of this project had brought about measurable changes through its programmes and activities of capacity building/skill development of SHG members the direct beneficiaries of this project and awareness programmes which had motivated, guided and strengthened the members of the SHGs and Federation towards sustainable development by taking up livelihood activities and social transformation activities.



2.3 Women Empowerment and Sustainable Livelihood Enhancement through Self Help Groups - Gobardhan Grant Village in Chandrapur, Kamrup District, Assam



Initiated in February 2019 by FAsCE India and is supported by Manos Unidas, Spain, the project facilitated strengthening of the existing 15 Self Help Groups and promoted formation of 10 new Self Help Groups in the project areas since its inception. This project is a community based empowerment and sustainable livelihood programme through Self Help Groups. With the goal - "Improved living standard and increased sustainable livelihood opportunities for women of the target village of Gobardhan Grant through promotion and strengthening of SHGs and Federations". Hence, the major components of this project is on capacity building for women empowerment, skill development on alternative livelihood options, creating community assets and networking and linkages with Block development office and banks to further their strength and development.

2.4 Prevention of Sexual and Gender based Violence against Women and Girls in Assam

The specific objective of the project is to prevent gender based violence (GBV) through the empowerment of 1300 women and girls, particularly those coming from rural tribal communities, in two districts of Assam State (Karimganj and Kamrup). The beneficiaries are 80 Self Help Groups from Manikbond in Karimganj District and Narengi in Kamrup District of Assam. And it is being supported by Otto per Mille of the Waldensian Church.



2.5 Integrated Village Development Programme

The ongoing project is being implemented by Seva Kendra, the zonal office of FAsCE India at Manikbond in Lowaipoa Block under Karimganj District of Assam. The objective of project is to improve the living condition of poor people effecting a sustainable improvement in Economic standard, Health care facilities, and empowerment of women. And this project is being supported by AIFO, Italy. The programmes carried out are for Self Help Groups, Coaching Centre and Dispensary - Health care service.



Major Activities implemented under the above mentioned projects during 2019-20:

1. Social & Community Awareness

* **Participatory Rural Appraisal:** It was conducted at Gobardhan Village, Chandrapur for empowerment of the locals to participate in the identification of issues and evaluation process to carry out development activities in their respective community. It was carried out on April 4 and 5, 2019. There were 35 participants and they were - SHG members, community leaders, village elders, including MSW interns and FAsCE India Project Coordinator.



* **Awareness on Human Rights:** On December 10, 2019 the Human Rights Day was observed at Amsing Jorbat. It was organized to create awareness among the SHGs of the community. 85 SHG members participated in the programme. The resource-person was Mr. Abhinash Narzary from Legal Cell, Guwahati.



- * **Awareness on Women Empowerment:** In the month of February 2020, women empowerment awareness programme was held for SHG members and women at Amsing Jorabat. The programme enlightened the participants about their entitlements. The programme was facilitated by FAsCE India resource team.



- * **Seminar on Women's Rights for Community Stakeholders:** On September 26, 2019 the seminar was held to create network between the community stakeholder and FAsCE India for prevention of gender based violence. 45 community members participated in the seminar held at Narengi.



- * **Street Theatre on Domestic Violence and Human Trafficking:** Street theatre was held to promote gender awareness and prevention of gender based violence organised by FAsCE India in collaboration with MSW Interns from TISS, Guwahati Campus. On April 8, 2019 it was held at the weekly market in Panikhaiti reaching out to 300 audiences. And on April 10, 2019 it was held in Geetamandir community 150 people witnessed the theatre.



- * **Public Awareness Programme for Stakeholder:** On September 30, 2019 one day workshop was held at Seva Kendra, Manikbond. The workshop was an effort to engage the stakeholders to take action and respond to the promotion of women's equality and role of men in its implementation. 60 stakeholders from the community participated in the programme. Ms Sumana Nathan, Advocate cum Social Activist was the resource person.



2. Formation, Orientation and Capacity Building

- * **SHG Clusters formation as Vigilance Committees, Manikbond:** SHG Cluster was formed on April 29, 2019 to equip the SHGs as Vigilance Committee for prevention of gender based violence. 6 SHGs from Pipla Punjee and Balipipla villages in Manikbond took part. It was facilitated by FAsCE India Manikbond.



Narengi: On May 11 and 14, 2019 eleventh and twelfth SHG clusters with 8 SHGs were formed in Shivmandir and Geetamandir. The formation meeting was facilitated by the FAsCE India head-office staff.



- * **Formation of new SHGs:** 10 new SHGs was formed under FAsCE India on May 23, 2019 at Gobardhan village, Chandrapur.



- * **Orientation and Formation of Mobile Legal Aid Team:** On May 14 and 15, 2019 Four member team were selected from the community for the formation of mobile legal aid team. They were given orientation on role and tasks of the team by Mr. Abhinash Narzary, member of Legal Cell and Ms. Chaya Kalita, Women's Coordinator.

5. Monitoring Visit and Evaluation

- * Evaluation Meeting- On August 30, 2019 Fr. Saji George, Director, FASCE India conducted the review and evaluation meeting with the Local Project team at Somonpara project centre.
- * Monitoring Visit - The Executive Director of FASCE India on June 10, 2019 visited the Adult Literacy Centres at Garobasti, Gobardhan Village in Chandrapur, Assam. He interacted with the students and staff of the centre also took stock of the classroom teachings and attendance.
- * Monitoring Visit - On October 20, 2019 benefactors' team from Manos Unidas, Spain visited the project area in Gobardhan village, Chandrapur, Assam. The visiting team monitored the project activities, interacted with beneficiaries, visited the adult literacy centres and scrutinized the SHG various books. A brief reception programme was organised by FASCE India in collaboration with the SHGs to welcome and felicitate the benefactors.



3. FASCE INDIA EDUCATION PROGRAMME

Education is the most powerful weapon that can be used to change and transform the society. FASCE India ensures educational opportunities for children and young people from socio-economically marginalized background across Northeast India. The various educational programmes of FASCE India provide assistances and opportunities to access quality education for its beneficiaries. The major component of this programme is scholarship / sponsorship and building school facilities.

3.1 FAsCE Education Assistance Fund (FEAF)

Fransalian Education Assistance Fund [FEAF] is an initiative of FAsCE India to support students, from school level to professional level, to pursue their academics without any break owing to their economic, social or demographic backwardness. FAsCE India facilitated the purchase the computers at its Registered office in Shillong to enhance the education and study of the Scholastics at MSFS Study House.



3.5 Water and Sanitary Facility at Kaying

Sanitary, water tank and rain water harvesting facilities were the dire needs to provide quality residential education for the tribal children at Kaying, Arunachal Pradesh. Realizing these needs FAsCE India facilitated the construction of the same. The construction of the water tanks were completed and the construction of the toilet block is in progress.

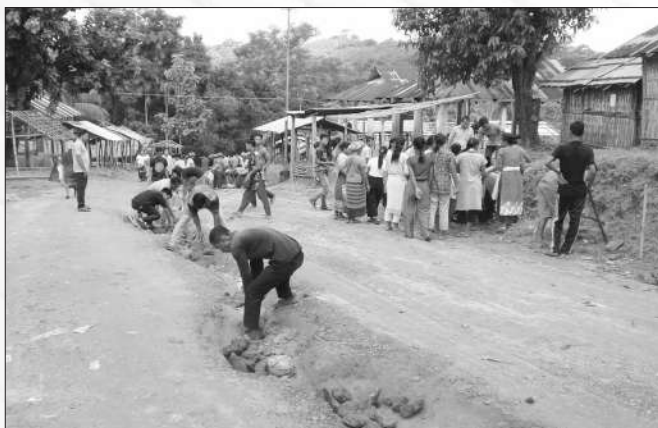
*** Green FAsCE India**

7. EMERGENCY, RELIEF AID AND HUMANITARIAN RESPONSE PROGRAMME

1. Assam Flood 2019

The flood relief support was carried out in two phases. FAsCE India head-office at Guwahati coordinated the implementation of the activities in most effective manner in collaboration with its zonal centres at Jonai, Gogamukh and Silapathar. In the first phase immediate flood relief distribution comprising of essential commodities mostly food items and drinking water were distributed. And in the second phase medical camp, health awareness and necessary items for maintaining health and hygiene conditions were distributed to the flood affected families for rehabilitation and prevention. Thus, FAsCE India could reach out to a total of 2779 families in their time of need and emergency, 452 Families in the first phase and around 1340 families in the second phase and 987 families with medical assistance.

2. Construction of House for a family in Kerala

MSFS NE India Province collaborated with FAsCE India to carry out this humanitarian response which was completed in November 2019.



3. Installation of Tube Wells with Hand pumps in Gogamukh

As part of the flood relief programme, ten tube wells with hand pumps were installed for Villagers and Tea-Garden workers in Bordoibam village & Tea Garden in Gogamukh by FAsCE India on December 03, 2019.



4. Solace to the needy during Pandemic [COVID-19]

* Awareness on Coronavirus

At the outset of the Coronavirus - COVID 19 pandemic FAsCE India head-office had organised community awareness programme in the communities as well as in the Supplementary Education Centres as a precautionary measure for safety of human lives from life threatening contagion from novel Coronavirus. The awareness programme highlighted the precautionary measures of social distancing, frequent hand-washing and the symptoms. The community health-workers and medical



personnel shared their experts on maintaining health and hygiene conditions for effective prevention. Free masks and hand-sanitizers were distributed to the participants who attended the awareness programme. The awareness programme was initiated from March 13 to March 26, 2020. The programme reached out to nearly 2050 people.

* **Distribution of Relief Aid during Lockdown at Guwahati**

During the 21-day lockdown the families living in very poor conditions were given essential food items - rice, dal, potato, cooking oil, soap and mask. The relief distribution in Narengi-Satgaon areas, Guwahati began on March 29, 2020 during these period 425 families was helped.

* **Inauguration of FAsCE India Community Facilitation Centre**

The newly constructed FAsCE India Community Facilitation Centre at Silapathar, Assam was inaugurated and blessed on November 10, 2019 for operation to carry out various developmental activities, projects and programmes. India and blessed by Most Rev. Michael Akasius Toppo, Bishop of Tezpur in the presence of Rev. Fr. Emmanuel Mappilaparambil, Regional Superior of MSFS Dibrugarh Region, Fr. Saji George, Executive Director, FAsCE India, and many invited and distinguished guests from various walks of life.



* **House for the needy**

House was constructed for Mr. Petrus Tirkey, staff of HRRC, Tura in Bahalpur, Dhubri District, Assam in collaboration with SFS School, Bahalpur. And the construction was completed on September 11, 2019.



* **Safe Drinking Water and Kitchen Facility**

Addressing the scarcity of water FAsCE India facilitated the construction of 10,000 litres water tank at SFS School, Yingkiong, Arunachal Pradesh. With the completion of construction of the water tank in November 2019 the school will now be able to store sufficient water ensuring adequate water supply for drinking, washing and sanitation even in winter months.



9. PROMOTING PROGRESS THROUGH MOBILITY

During this review period FAsCE India facilitated in purchase of new vehicles for the FAsCE India registered Office at Shillong, Meghalaya and Silapathar Assam. It also facilitated a means of transport for the SFS Technical Institute Diphu. The vehicles ensure free mobility with ease for implementation of the project activities at its project areas.
