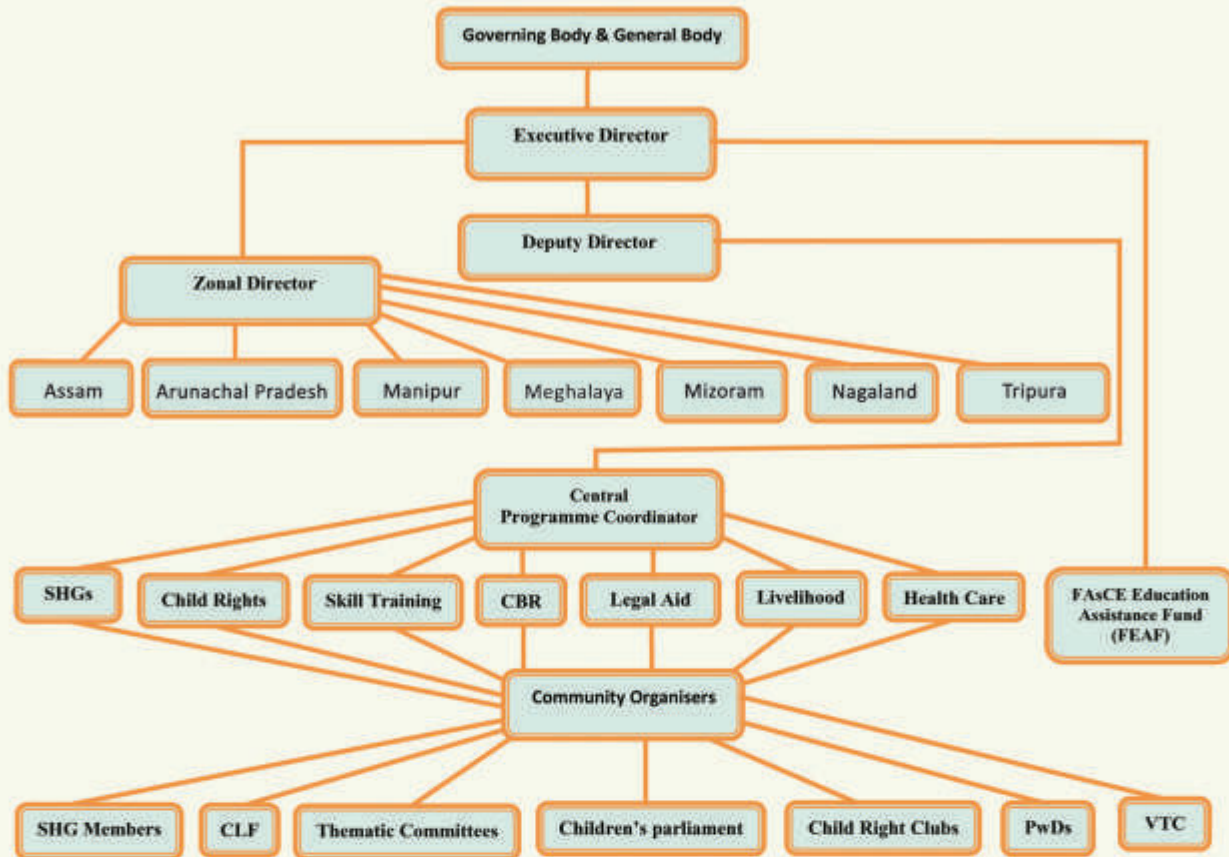
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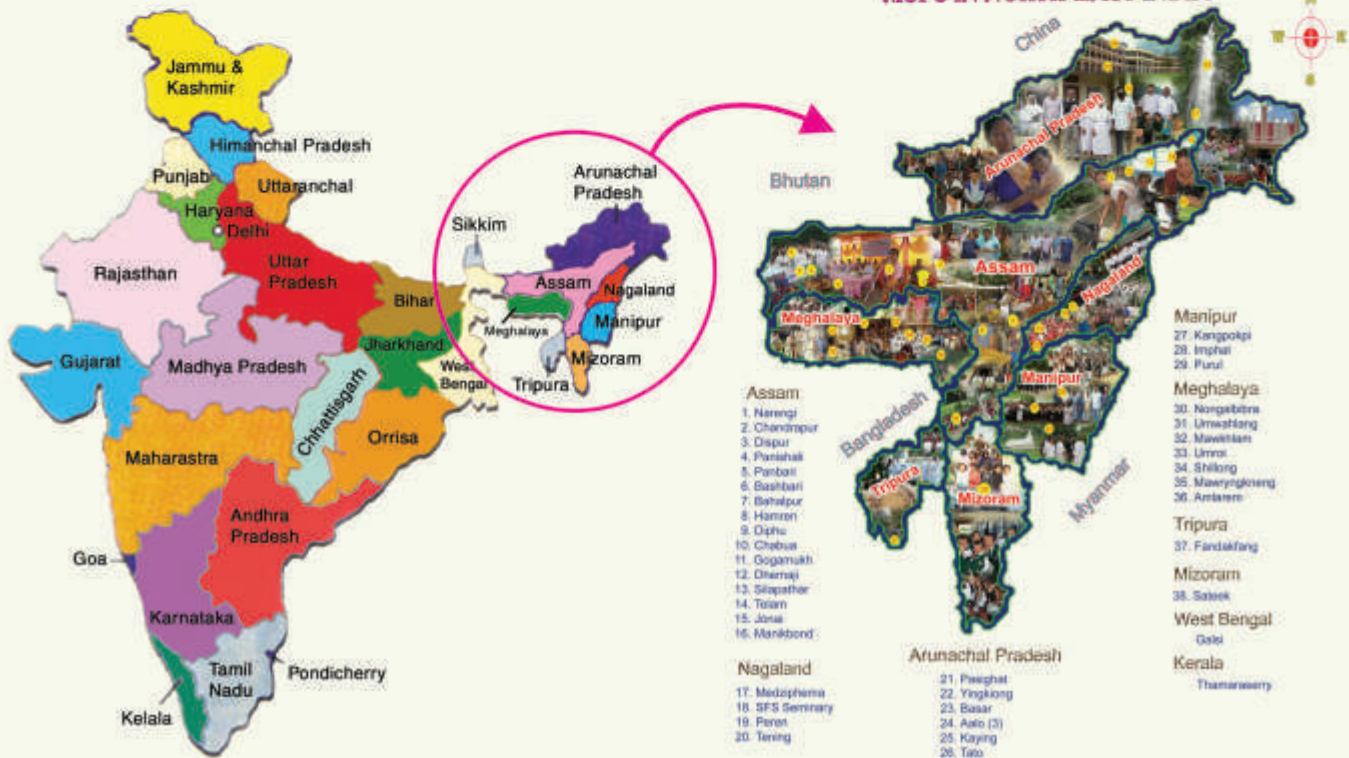

COVID CARE 2021

2021 has been a challenging year with the second wave of the Covid-19 and economic crisis. Many of the livelihood sources of poor households were stripped off due to economic instability and lockdown restrictions for more than a year. In order to provide some relief to the underprivileged families, FAsCE India launched COVID Care 2021. The programme aimed at providing information, essential food items, medicines, immunity boosters and other life saving materials to the needy families.



FAsCEHELPDESK

FAsCE Help Desks was set up at Narengi, Amsing Jorabat, Geetamandir, Bonda, Bongaon, Hatigaon, Ekrabari and Gorbardhan and provided information about COVID 19 transmission and precautions. Additionally, awareness on COVID vaccine, telephonic registration and appointments for vaccination were carried out.

100TH EPISODE OF COVID CARE 2021

On the 100th episode of Covid Care 2021, the beneficiaries people were distributed with Immunity booster kits, dry rations and medicines. Simultaneously, FAsCE India conducted awareness campaigns and sanitization drives.

DAILY MEAL DELIVERY

FAsCE India launched Daily Meal Delivery and reached out to 5927 individuals.

DISTRIBUTION OF IMMUNITY BOOSTER KITS

Immunity Booster kits with health drink, vitamin C tablets, N95 masks, sanitizer, menthol for steam inhalation and soap were distributed to more than 1000 poor families

SURVIVAL KITS

Survival Kits containing rice, dal, oil, potato, onion, salt, soya bean were distributed in suburban localities, interior villages, slums and tea-gardens. The beneficiaries included sick, senior citizens, single mothers, differently-abled and rickshaw pullers. The survival kits were distributed at Guwahati, Mawryngkneng, Galsi, Bahalpur, Panishali and Sateek.

DISTRIBUTION OF MASK

During the pandemic face masks were distributed to underprivileged children in the Supplementary Education Centres





DISTRIBUTION OF MEDICINES

AYUSH 64 Argenic Album 30 were distributed to 10500 beneficiaries.

FACILITIES FOR FRONTLINE HEALTH WORKERS

As a goodwill gesture to frontline workers, FAsCE India distributed oximeters, masks, sanitisers and gloves to police personnel and health care workers.

OXYGEN CONCENTRATORS

An oxygen concentrators were acquired to meet the rising demand of Covid patients. The oxygen concentrators were made available at Manikbond, Bahalpur and Umwhalang.

SANITIZATION DRIVE

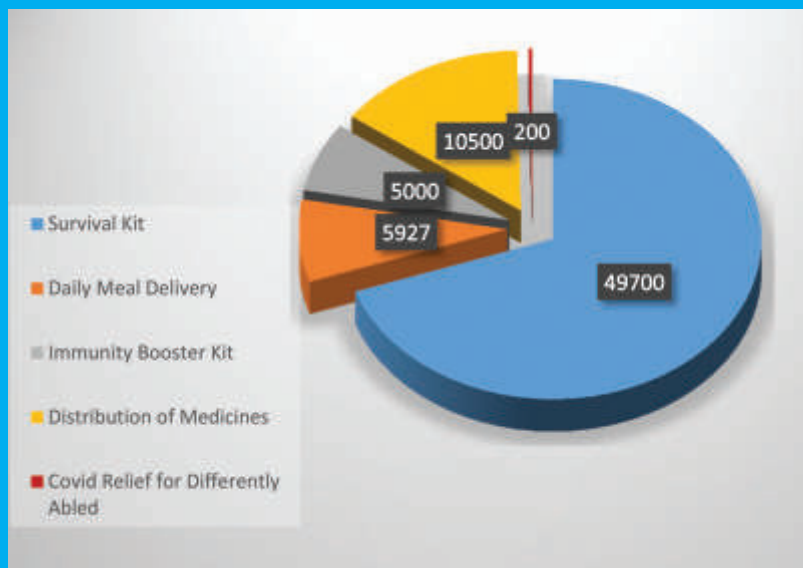
FAsCE India along with Nabajyoti Club and Nagrik Committee launched "Sanitization Drive" in Satgaon.

STUDY FACILITY

In order to help under privileged students Mini Study Centres were launched. The children were provided with gadgets to pursue their studies during the pandemic.

COVID RELIEF

Immunity boosters and food items were provided to 200 differently abled. Vitamins, sugar, tea leaves, dal, peas, soyabean and soaps were included in the relief materials.

LIVELIHOOD SUPPORT

The second wave of pandemic worsened the livelihood sources of many people. FAsCE India supported Mr. Ramprakash who worked as contractor with financial assistance. He began selling vegetables and snacks to sustain his livelihood.

REMEDIAL EDUCATION DURING COVID-19

During Covid-19, supplementary education was provided to deserving children. Co-curricular activities were conducted for all round and holistic development. The organization distributed study and learning materials to the children

TAILORING AND KNITTING TRADE AT MANIKBOND

During the pandemic, FAsCE India initiated training on tailoring and knitting for women and school drop out girls for self-employment. 24 women have undergone training so far.

FAsCE India was felicitated at Rastriya Sankardev Sarcha programme organised by Democracy Live and Maramland Welfare Society at Srimanta Sankaradev Namghar, Dispur Last Gate, Guwahati on October 17, 2021. FAsCE India was selected for this honour because of its commendable humanitarian service to the society, especially, for its outreach programmes during the Covid 19 pandemic. Srimanta Sankardev was a 15th-16th century Assamese polymath; a saint scholar, poet, playwright, dancer, actor, musician, artist, social-religious reformer and a figure of importance in the cultural and religious history of Assam. The programme was attended by many eminent personalities from various walks of life. Miss Chaya Kalita received the honour on behalf of FAsCE India.

FIRST ANNIVERSARY OF MOTHER'S MEAL

The Mother's Meal Project which was started on 15th August 2020, continued its journey of reaching out to the neediest people and completed its one year of service in August 2021. It is a hunger relief movement started by Bangalore based Project Vision. This project has identified 25 deserving families each in Sateek, Mizoram and Sindhukpathar, Tripura and provides a Survival Food Kit with essential items worth Rs. 500 each month. Sincere thanks to Project Vision for the financial support and collaboration.





4.1 FORMATION OF 10 NEW SHG AT GEETAMANDIR

10 new SHGs were formed in Geetamandir and orientation was given on 21st February 2022. Fr. Saji George, General Secretary for Formation and FAsCE India team was part of the major event. Fr. Saji George spoke on the importance of forming SHGs and highlighted the benefits of becoming SHG member. The SHGs were advised to follow the Panchasutra: five principles of SHG sincerely in order to be a successful group. One of the key principles is maintaining books of records, a factor responsible for success or failure of SHGs. The SHGs were also encouraged to form more groups in order to help each other and receive financial assistance from the Government. The newly formed groups were excited and at the same time there were lots of doubts on their face. FAsCE India team informed and assured the group that they will be provided with training and handholding from time to time. The SHGs were advised to register themselves in Government programs like NULM to get maximum benefit from welfare schemes.





4.2 STRENGTHENING OF 25 SHGS AT GOBARDHAN, CHANDRAPUR

One day capacity building and strengthening programme was conducted on 29th March 2022 at Gobardhan Grant village. The objective of the programme was to build the capacity of SHGs and improve their skills. Team building activities were conducted to strengthen the members and groups. Ms. Chaya Kalita, Programme Coordinator, FAsCE India took a daylong session to explain the concepts and functioning of SHGs. Various topics on Organizational Management and Financial Management was discussed in the training programme. At the end of the programme, there was Question & Answer and feedback session. The programme coordinator assured the groups with all necessary help from the organization.

4.3 WORKSHOP ON WOMEN ISSUES AT GEETA MANDIR

To create awareness among women, "Workshop on Women Issues" was organized on 31st March, 2022 at Geeta Mandir. Mrs. Mousmi Saikia Kalita, the resource person spoke on fundamental rights of women at length and encouraged women to be alert and proactive. The resource person discussed about gender discrimination and gender equality which is a burning issue worldwide. The event was a grand success and more than 200 women and children participated in the workshop.





PROMOTION OF CHILD RIGHTS

FAACE India opened **13 new Supplementary Education Centres** in the year 2021-22

FAACE India facilitated and **equipped the newly constructed Boy's Hostel at Somonpara** with basic and necessary furniture: desks, benches, tables, chairs, dining tables, cots etc.

5.1 NEW SUPPLEMENTARY EDUCATION CENTRES

In the second quarter of 2021, FAsCE India opened two new supplementary education centres in Sualiluka and Sampath. Another 10 new centres were inaugurated in Chapar, Dhubri district by Fr. Biju Kanicherry, Principle of SFS School, Bahalpur in the presence of Fr. Saji George, Fr. Stephen Marayikulam, Local Project Director. During the first quarter of 2022, a new Supplementary Education Centre was inaugurated at Gobardhan Village, Chandrapur on 26th February 2022.

The purpose of these centres is to facilitate the study of children in interior villages. These centres aim at motivating the children towards achieving their goal for a better life. The children registered to the centres are in the age group of 5 to 14 years, mainly comprising of school going, few out-of-school and some dropouts. Free tuition classes and co-curricular activities are organized from Monday to Saturday.



5.2 FASCE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMME

FasCE India ensures educational opportunities for children and young people from socio-economically marginalized background across Northeast India. The various educational programmes of FasCE India provide assistances and opportunities to access quality education for the children. The major component of this programme is scholarship/sponsorship for the children who otherwise cannot afford the cost for the education. During the academic year FasCE has ensured the education of more than 250 children.



5.3 AWARENESS ON MENTAL HEALTH AND EMOTIONAL FREEDOM TECHNIQUES

On 19th December 2021, FAsCE India in collaboration with Amirt Asmi Institute of Living Life and mera Man Foundation organized awareness programme on Mental Health and Emotional Freedom Techniques (EFT) for children from Supplementary Education Centre at Narengi. EFT is a form of counselling intervention that stimulates acupressure points by pressuring, tapping or rubbing these points while focusing on situations that represent personal fear or traumata. In EFT session, the person will focus on a specific issue while tapping on end points of the body's energy meridians. The children were given practical techniques to tap on meridian endpoints of the body - such as the top of the head, eyebrows, under eyes, side of eyes, chin etc. While tapping, they were instructed to recite specific phrase that target an emotional component of a physical symptom. This method is helpful for the people with anxiety, depression, chronic pain, stress, weight loss issues etc.



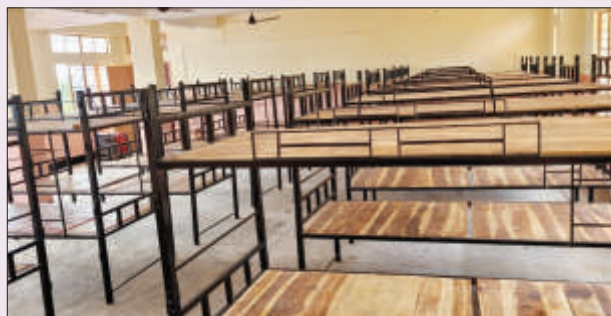
5.4 ANNUAL ART AND PHOTOGRAPHY EXHIBITION

FAsCE India participated in the 4th Annual Art and Photography Exhibition held at Artist Guild Gallery, Chandmari, Guwahati on October 24, 2021. Paintings and photography of various artists across the state was exhibited including the 7 paintings of children from FAsCE Supplementary Education Centre, Narengi. The inaugural ceremony was graced by various renowned artists of Assam. Fr. Saji George, speaking on the occasion, appreciated the budding artist for exhibiting their talents by giving expression to their imagination on the canvas. He also applauded Imaginary Canvas, an initiative by the team of youth who are promoting creative and visual art skills, for providing platform for the young children of our society and encouraged the assembly to think creatively, positively and substantially by giving wings to their imagination. The young artists were awarded with certificate of participation.



5.5 LIFE SKILL PROGRAMME AT SUPPLEMENTARY EDUCATION CENTRE

To equip the children with social and life skills, FAsCE India introduced Life Skill Programme at supplementary education centre. Mrs. Mousumi Saikia Kalita, an entrepreneur, trained the student to cook fast food items and other snacks. It is an essential life skill to be independent and confident. This skill will also help the children to engage in fund raising activities for community or voluntary works. Another activity carried out by the resource person is colour personality test. In this activity, the students are asked to choose their favourite colour. Based on their colour choice, the student's personality traits are interpreted. This exercise is helpful in self-reflection and self-disclosure.



5.6 FURNITURE FOR BOY'S HOSTEL AT SOMONPARA

In order to promote quality and affordable education and to provide better facilities for residential education of the poor tribal children from the interior villages of Somonpara, West Garo Hills, Meghalaya, FAsCE India facilitated and equipped the newly constructed Boy's Hostel with basic and necessary furniture: desks, benches, tables, chairs, dining tables, cots etc. The objective of this project is to access quality residential education at low cost to the poor tribal children living in distant villages in and around Somonpara where they have no facility for quality education, thereby preventing illiteracy, school dropout and child labour. The newly furnished hostel would enhance a better ambience for study and learning.

REUNION WITH SCHOOL

I was born in a family of limited means. I always wanted to go to school and study. Unfortunately, my parents did not send me to school. I fought with my parents and started going to school. After few years, my parents compelled me to drop out from school and support the family economically. One day, my friend informed me about Supplementary Education Centre at Narengi. As I started visiting the centre, I began to enjoy the classes. I always wanted to dance and perform in front of crowds. But without going to school this was not possible. My dream came true after joining the supplementary classes. Thank you FAsCE Supplementary Centre. Now, I am back to school and currently studying in 6th Standard.

LIVELIHOOD PROMOTION DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

6.1 INAUGURATION OF MURI FACTORY

A cottage industry business venture was taken up by Mrs. Deepali Murari, a woman leader of Amsing Jorabat. She is the President of village organisation and an active SHG member. With a zeal of earning and supporting her family financially especially in this challenging time, Mrs. Deepali with two more persons in her team bought a Muri making factory at 10th Mile with a small capital investment. The factory was blessed and inaugurated on 6th September, 2021 by Fr. Saji George, Executive Director of FAsCE India. It is indeed a way forward for many of her counterparts to take up small scale livelihood activities.



6.2 DISTRIBUTION OF LIVELIHOOD SUPPORT TO 10 SHGS

FAsCE India on 27th September, 2021, distributed livelihood support to SHGs of Amsing Jorabat. These SHGs facilitated by FAsCE India are active groups engaged in community development activities and income generating activities as well. During the distribution ceremony Fr. Saji George, Executive Director of FAsCE India handed over the livelihood support cheque to the deserving 10 SHGs to ramp up their income generating activities.



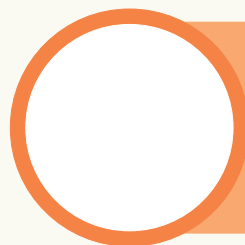
6.3 LIVELIHOOD BUSINESS DURING COVID-19

The impact of the pandemic had devastating effects on SHGs and their livelihood activities due to disruption in supply chain and job lose of male members in their families. The women of Geetamandir SHGs took an innovative idea to revive their household and group income. They had started making traditional, nutritious snacks and selling in their locality. Some of the groups have put up stalls to sell their

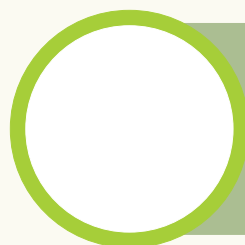
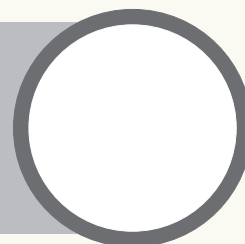

7.1 PREVENTIVE MEDICINES TO 10,000 BENEFICIARIES UNDER 'AZADI KA AMRIT MAHOTSAV'

FAsCE India in collaboration with the Regional Research Institute of Homoeopathy (RRIH), under Central Council of Research in Homoeopathy, Ministry of AYUSH distributed Arsenic Album 30 to 10000 beneficiaries, as mass prophylaxis as a part of 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav' under India @75, as per the Standard Operating Procedures given by the Ministry of AYUSH from 30th August to 5th September. 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav' is a series of events being organized by the government to commemorate the 75th Anniversary of India's Independence. The project locations were Guwahati, Telam, Bahalpur, Manikbond in Assam and Somapara in Meghalaya.





7.2 AWARENESS PROGRAMME ON PREVENTION OF COVID-19 BY AYUSH TEAM

As a part of national campaign, the Regional Research Institute of Homoeopathy (RRIH), under Central Council of Research in Homoeopathy, Ministry of AYUSH, partnering with FAsCE India conducted health awareness programmes in Amsing Jorbat and Geetamandir. Dr. Liyi Karso, Nodal officer and team reached out to the general population with a special focus on the geriatric people with preventive health messages, healthy diet and lifestyle and distributed preventive medicines and leaflets with instructions for daily healthy living. Similar awareness programme was also held on 16th February 2022 at Ekrabari and Hathisila. More than 300 people participated in the programme and various preventive measures were discussed

7.3 HEALTH AWARENESS PROGRAMME

During the time of pandemic one key challenge is to ensure prevention, good health practices and adequate hygiene. Community level health awareness programme was organised to equip people with information on prevention and health & hygiene practices. The programme was held on 29th July, 2021 at Bahalpur in Dhubri district of Assam and Mr. Wahid, the resource person enlightened the people of the tea garden community about basic health tips. He encouraged people to frequently wash hands, eat healthy food, observe physical distance and avoid crowded places. Another awareness programme on prevention of COVID-19 was held on 9th September 09, 2021 at Gobardhan village in Chandrapur. Miss Chaya Kalita, resource person emphasized on self-care guidelines for preventive health measures

and immunity boosting food and medications.

FAsCE facilitated Health Camp and Awareness Programme in collaboration with National Institute of Pharmaceutical Education and Research (NIPER), Guwahati under ICMR Project "Integrated Information System to interpret, integrate and mitigation of cardio metabolic Health Care" and Regional Research Institute (Homeopathy) Guwahati on December 04, 2021 in Amsing Jorabat. The 16 member medial team, consisted of Lab technicians, pharmacists and 4 doctors conducted comprehensive health check up with on-spot pathology test for recommended patients. There were 147 beneficiaries. Medicines were freely distributed to the patients during the camp.



7.4 AYUSH 64 TO COVID PATIENTS

The impact of the second wave of the COVID-19 pandemic has been severe in Assam, more so in the Kamrup Metro district with a higher caseload in this quarter of the year. FAsCE India in collaboration with the Regional Research Institute of Homoeopathy, Guwahati continued the distribution of AYUSH 64 medicines in asymptomatic and mild to moderate Covid-19 patients in home isolation and Arsenic Album 30 for mass prophylaxis as per the Standard Operating Procedure given by the Ministry of AYUSH. The effort was highly appreciated by the beneficiaries, as it was difficult for many to access the medicines.



7.5 FREE HEALTH CAMP, PAN INDIA LEGAL AWARENESS AND OUTREACH CAMPAIGN



On November 11, 2021, Free Health Camp was organized at SFS School Somonpara, West Garo Hills Meghalaya by the District Legal Services Authority (DLSA) in collaboration with the office of the District Medical and Health offices (DHMO) and District Social Welfare (DSW), West Garo Hills. A day long mega health camp was held to mark the Pan India Legal Awareness and Outreach Campaign to provide and create awareness on number of free-services available. FAsCE India Somonpara provided help-desk support to facilitate and share information about the free health services and how to avail these service to the participants of this camp. Many specialist like Orthopaedics, Dermatologist, paediatric Ophthalmology, Psychiatry, ENT were available for the medical camp and all vertical programmes like Mega Health Insurance, Aadhaar enrolment, ICDS,

community and Rural Development were also accessible. District Legal Services, routine Vaccination, Covid vaccination, and adolescent health services were also provided. A sizable numbers of students, village people, Nokma, Sordar and members of Self Help Groups benefitted from the free medical service. Around 900 patients from 15 villages received specialist care and other services.

On December 08, FAsCE organized Health Camp and Awareness Programme for Tribal Population in collaboration with NIPER and RRI (H) Guwahati at Gobardhan village. The 18 member medical team consisted of doctors, lab technicians, and pharmacists conducted comprehensive health check up with on-spot pathology test for recommended patients. There were 203 beneficiaries and they expressed their satisfaction in getting free medical care

YOUTH EMPOWERMENT 8



Fransalian Youth Mission in collaboration with FAsCE India organized Fransalian Youth Convention, held from December 10-12, 2021 at St. Joseph's Parish, Manikbond, Assam. The theme of the Convention was: "Young Man I Say to You Arise." Rev Fr Mathew Muriyankuriyal, the Chief Guest, hoisted the flag and declared the Convention opened. In his message, the Chief Guest appealed the young people, to be good leaders and to lead by exemplary life because the future of the nation depends on the educational and spiritual exposure and strength of the youth. In all, 180 youth from several villages took part in the convention. The Resource persons Fr John Barman, Director of Fransalian Youth Mission, Fr Clean Areng, the Parish Priest and Sisters, pointed out the importance of growing in knowledge and being good and educated individuals in order to be good leaders in the society. Various cultural competitions were conducted and prizes were awarded.

A similar convention was organized at St Jude's Parish, Bahalpur, held from December 17-19, 2021. The resource persons enlightened the youth with various relevant topics like; Education, Health and Hygiene, Motivation etc.

PLATFORM FOR PERSONAL GROWTH



My name is Nurnahar Siddika and I am 19 years old. I live in a kutchha / makeshift house along with my parents and 2 siblings. Due to his deteriorating health he cannot work anymore. My mother who worked as regular domestic helper is finding difficult to get work post Covid-19.

At present I am pursuing BA Political Science, IInd Semester in Narengi Anchalik College, Narengi. My association with FAsCE Supplementary Education started when I was studying in Class-VIII in the year 2016. I came to know about Supplementary Education Centre in Narengi through my friends and I have been coming to the centre till date. I learnt a lot of things which was not taught in my school. I was taught to be disciplined and sincere in my duties. The teacher in the centre helped me in identifying my hidden talents and in the process I developed confidence to speak on stage. The organization provided me with study materials and other resources whenever I needed.

Due to my family's economic condition, I requested FAsCE India to some assistance. Now I am working as a part time teacher in the Supplementary Education Centre to provide support to my family. I am also engaged as volunteer in my locality and motivate other children to attend the supplementary classes. In future, I want to become lawyer and ensure justice to the underprivileged. I am indebted to FAsCE India for the immense help and providing me with platform for personal growth. -

Abraham, The Superior General, MSFS in the presence of Fr. Sabu Francis, The Provincial, MSFS, Fr. Jose Thekkel, The Superior, Fr. Saji George, The General Secretary for Formation, inmates of MSFS Provincialate Community, Narengi and Venerini Sisters blessed and inaugurated the new house of Mr. Jafranus Munda. The new house consisted of 2 bedroom, 1 kitchen and 1 toilet. The family members expressed their heartfelt gratitude for the generosity and humanitarian service of FAsCE India.

COMMUNITY SOCIAL WORK FOR A NOBLE CAUSE

Three days, on November 10 & 27 and December 18, 2021, FAsCE India organized community social work to facilitate the construction of Mr Jafranus Munda at Taltala, Guwahati. The FAsCE family members from Amsing Jorabat, Hatishila and Bongaon came together to engage in community service for this noble cause. EVALUATION^{AND} MONITORING VISITS

13



13.1 REVIEW MEETING

The monthly review meeting was conducted at Seva Kendra in Manikbond under the chairmanship of Fr Clean Areng. In the review meeting the project team evaluated and assessed the progress of the Self Help Groups and Supplementary Education Centres. During the meeting the facilitators of Supplementary Education Centres demonstrated various activities. Another review meeting was held in the first quarter of 2022 in the presence of present and former Executive Director. Similar review meetings were held at Chapar, Somonpara.

A final evaluation was carried out at Somonpara with the following objectives: to assess the project and the implementation of its activities;

to evaluate the effectiveness, involvement and role of the staff in the project activities; to study the success of the project through field visit, interview of the beneficiaries; to review the documentation; and the sustainability of the project.



13.2 INTERACTION WITH SHGS

FAsCE India head office team paid a visit to SHGs of Manikbond and had interaction session. The SHGs shared about their experiences as a group and highlighted their needs for loans to meet the demand of the group members. The team assured the SHG with financial assistance if they function well with consistency. The books of records and other documents were checked and it was found to be well maintained.



13.3 TAILORING & KNITTING CENTRE

The tailoring and knitting centre have been functioning well, providing livelihood opportunities to many underprivileged women. Young girls and women are now hopeful to start something on their own after completing the courses. Fr. Saji George, General Secretary for Formation and FAsCE India head office team met the trainees and applauded their effort and enthusiasm. The trainees were informed on various career opportunities and scope in the field of tailoring and knitting.



13.4 MONITORING VISIT TO SUPPLEMENTARY EDUCATION CENTRE

During the monitoring visit, FAsCE India team interacted with the teachers and students of the Supplementary Centres. The team visited the centre to assess the status of the supplementary centre and to encourage the children to attend the free classes. To motivate the children, co-curricular activities were conducted. The teachers were advised to maintain proper record of the students. The centre was provided with study materials, educational charts, display posters and sports items to enhance the learning experience and to boost physical health at the same time. The monitoring visit was carried out at Manikbond, Ekkrabari, Sampathar, Sualiluka and Chandrapur.



NATIONAL AND 14 INTERNATIONAL DAYS

14.1 WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY

This year the World Environment Day was observed under the theme "Ecosystem Restoration" in a low key manner due to the pandemic. At the community level, the members of various SHGs, community leaders and children in Narengi, Chandrapur, Ekrabari, Bongaon, Amsing Jorabat and Geetamandir marked the day by planting a sapling as a symbolic gesture and it was facilitated by FAsCE India.



14.2 INDEPENDENCE DAY

The 75th Independence Day was celebrated on August 15, 2021 by FAsCE India at its Supplementary Education Centres in Narengi, Ekrabari, Bongaon, Sampathar, Suwaliluka and Amsing Jorabat community. The day was marked by unfurling of national flag by the guest on the occasion in each of the respective centres hosting the celebration, followed by singing of national anthem. And thematic cultural performances by the children added colour and meaning to the celebration.

It also aims at amplifying and empowering the voices of adolescent girls around the globe. Through observing this day, an attempt is made to talk about and eradicate the issues concerning adolescent girl children. Throughout the world, girls face gender-based challenges such as child marriage, discrimination, violence, and poor learning opportunities. International Day of the Girl Child 2021 was observed under the theme of 'Digital Generation. Our Generation.' In Amsing Jorabat and 10th Mile the community level programme began with a short inaugural ceremony. 14.5 WORLD SIGHT DAY

World Sight Day (WSD) is an annual day set apart for the awareness to focus the global attention on blindness and vision impairment. It is the most important advocacy and communications event, on the eye health calendar and a great time to engage with the world at large. FAsCE India organized a Blind Walk at Amsing Jorabat, Guwahati on World Sight Day to express solidarity with 40 million visually challenged people. 'Love your Eyes' was the theme for this year. About 100 blind-folded children and Self Help Group Members participated in the event. The Walk was flagged off by the Director of FAsCE India. It was followed by a cultural programme. The senior children of FAsCE Supplementary Education Centre, Narengi presented a special dance performance with blind folds. Concluding the programme, Fr. Saji George in his message shared the aim of such event: to help those with vision to understand a little better what it is like for the visually-impaired people to move around through our gestures of solidarity and inclusive activities. He expressed that FAsCE India stands united for the visually challenged people and promote eye donation.





14.6 INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY

FASCE India celebrated International Women's day on 8th March 2022 as a mark of respect and appreciation to all the women. The event was organized with special focus on the theme "Gender equality today for a sustainable tomorrow" at Gobardhan, Chandrapur, Manikbond and Narengi.

The SHG members participated in games and cultural dances adding more colour to the occasion and prizes were distributed to the best performers. SHG stalls were set up for exhibition of SHG products. The idea behind the exhibition was to promote the SHG products and improve market linkages. 6 Village Organization received Cluster Level Federation fund in the form of Community Investment Fund for an amount of Rs. 3 lakh. Women from various Village Organization presented cultural dances to add more colour to the event. Best SHG awards were given on the occasion.

14.7 CHILDREN'S DAY 2021

This year FASCE India celebrated Children's Day at central and community levels with colourful cultural and sport events. The aim of the celebration was to promote, motivate and educate children and the stakeholders about child rights, care and education of children. The Children's Day celebration was held on November 26, 2021 in Memier Hall, Narengi. Rev. Fr Sabu Francis MSFS, Provincial of MSFS Guwahati Province graced the occasion as the Chief Guest. FASCE Supplementary Education Centres at Manikbond under the leadership of Fr Clean Arengch celebrated Children's Day on November 19, 2021. Similar programmes were held at Hatishila, Somonpara, Chapar, Sualiluka, Sampathar and Killingok.

14.8 PRE-CHRISTMAS CELEBRATION

INTERNSHIP PROGRAMME FOR SOCIAL WORK STUDENTS

FAsCE India as an emerging change maker in development sector, believes in holistic approach for all round development. Along with engaging professional staff, it also grooms social work trainees giving them hands on experience in the field of social work. Many students undertake internship at FAsCE India every year and in the year 2021-2022, 6 students engaged as social work interns. One of the student from Tata Institute of Social Sciences, Guwahati: Adrija Seth, MSW, 4th Semester was placed from 15th May to 5th June 2021. Due to lockdown and covid restrictions, the intern carried out the task through an online platform.

Another group of 5 students: Nandinee Sikdar, Safwan T, Saurav Batchas, Kunwar Singh and Simi Saikia, MSW 3rd Semester from Tata Institute of Social Sciences, Guwahati were engaged at FAsCE India for their Community Practicum. The students were placed at Hathhkola Suburi, Adivasi Tea Plantation Community from 20th to 30th September, 2021. Social work tools and techniques like Participatory Rural Appraisal, Interview and Focussed Group Discussion were used to carry out need assessment and identify the underlying problem.

The third group consisted of 4 students: Violet Duttson, Sulakhana Pandit, Jyoti Singh and Ashapurna Borpuzari, MSW 1st Semester. During the internship, the students made field visits and worked with SHGs in various locations of FAsCE India. They organised awareness program on relevant social issues in Supplementary Education Centres. The groups were also given opportunity to conduct baseline survey in new project areas of FAsCE India. The students submitted reports at the end of their fieldwork.
