This quarter also witnessed the launching of three more new projects: Phase II of Formation and Strengthening of 40 Self Help Groups for Improved Livelihood at Somonpara, West Garo Hills in Meghalaya, Women Empowerment and Sustainable Livelihood Enhancement through Self Help Groups at Gobardhan Grant Village of Chandrapur, Kamrup, District in Assam, and Educational Assistance to another 100 children across Northeast India. Besides, FAsCE India also focused on capacitating, empowering and strengthening the women, children, youth and lay leaders through various training and capacity building programmes. It also joined the rest of the nation and the world in celebrating, Republic Day, Holi and International Women's Day.

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INAUGURATION OF THE HEALTH FACILITATION CENTRE AT SOMONPARA

During the baseline survey conducted by FAsCE India in Somonpara and its neighbouring villages, it was found that health concern is one of the major issues faced by the people of Somonpara. Malaria, jaundice, TB and skin diseases are rampant. The nearest Primary Health Centre is 30 kilometres away from Somonpara. The visits of the health workers and medical personnel is infrequent. With the hope to address various health issues FAsCE India took the initiative of constructing a health facilitation centre to render health care services and conduct health programmes for the people of Somonpara. The newly

constructed Health Facilitation Centre at Somonpara, West Garo Hills District, in Meghalaya, was inaugurated on January 21, 2019 by Mr Shaji Adathala, President of Light in Life Organization, Switzerland and Mr Saleng A. Sangma, Local MLA, in the presence of Rev. Fr George Panthanmackel, Provincial of MSFS Northeast India Province, Representatives from Light in Life and village leaders. Most Rev. Andrew Marak, Bishop of Tura, blessed the newly constructed Health Facilitation Centre. A professionally trained nurse is in-charge of this centre to render first aid and emergency treatments to the patients who would visit the centre with different health issues. Since 2016, an ambulance is at the disposal of the people. FAsCE India expresses its heartfelt gratitude to the philanthropic friends and their families from Switzerland whose generous support made the construction of the health facilitation centre possible.



NEW TOILET BLOCKS AT SOMONPARA

The new school academic year also witnessed the inauguration of two newly constructed toilet blocks for boys and girls, at SFS School, Somonpara. The new facilities ensure health, hygiene and safety for the tribal children.



A SOLACE IN TIMES OF DISASTER

Cyclone Gaja wreaked havoc in Tamil Nadu, India, in the month of November 2018. The devastating cyclone damaged thousands of houses and buildings, uprooting trees, taking away the lives of people, disrupting transportation and communication system, leaving people without access to drinking water, destroying fishing boats and nets and, worst of all, destroying agricultural crops. Sharing in the sufferings of thousands who were helpless and homeless, FAsCE India and MSFS North East India Province responded to the call of MSFS Southeast India Province for assistance for relief and rehabilitation, by contributing its mite. In the first phase of the relief work, the affected people were provided with purified drinking water, bed sheets, tarpaulins, saris, candles, mosquito-coils and also all the necessary house hold things. The relief and reconstruction work was initiated under the able leadership of Fr Arockiasamy Selvaraj MSFS, Director, MDO SE India Province.



WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

SHG Clusters as Vigilance Committee against Gender Based Violence: As part of the AIFO project to promote and implement gender equality, tackling its structural causes and addressing all forms of gender based discrimination, new clusters were formed comprising of SHGs. The purpose of this cluster is to organise among them Vigilance Committees to prevent, to identify and to provide a response to cases of violence against women of the communities. On February 15, 2019 the second cluster was formed in Hatisila, which is a suburb community. Four Self Help Groups attended the formation meeting. The third, fourth, fifth, sixth and seventh clusters



were formed at Amsing Jorabat, which is located in the outskirts of Narengi. It is a large community with 20 Self Help Groups. The SHGs were invited to attend the cluster formation meeting held on February 22, 2019, at the Amsing Jorabat community. During the meeting 5 clusters were formed and 20 mentors were selected from the SHGs.

On March 31, 2019, the eighth SHG cluster under this project was formed in Ekrahari village. There are four SHG existing in this village. 40 members from the 4 SHGs attended the meeting. Prior to the meeting, the groups were animated by a team of resource persons from TATA Institute of Social Sciences, through games and group activities. The SHG clusters will act as vigilance committee against gender based violence.



Training for Formation and Strengthening of SHGs at Gobardhan: The initial phase of the community based empowerment and sustainable livelihood programme at Gobardhan village, in Chandrapur, started with a session on training for formation and for strengthening of the Self Help Groups. The training was held on February 23, 2019. More than hundred members from the existing 15 Self Help Groups participated in the training programme. Ms Chaya Kalita, Women's Coordinator, was the resource-person. During the session, she highlighted the objective of promotion and strengthening of SHGs by discussing the guiding principles of SHG, need, importance and scope of SHGs. The group activities conducted in the training aimed at making the participants aware about their strengths, resources and rights to constitute a just society. An overview about regular savings and internal loaning system enlightened the participants to become economically independent. This training programme was aimed at enabling the women to take leadership roles, to learn additional skills and so as to earn extra income, thereby utilizing their free time to generate savings. The day-long programme was concluded with fruitful sharing and planning of forthcoming activities of the SHGs, guided by the community mobilizers.



Staff Training and Orientation Programme at Chandrapur: Three day Staff Training and Orientation Programme for the new project "Women Empowerment and Sustainable Livelihood Enhancement through Self Help Groups at Gobardhan village, in Chandrapur," was held from February 26-28, 2019. The newly



recruited project staff and the project team from the head-office attended the training and project orientation, facilitated by the resource team from MASK. The objective of this training and orientation was to familiarise the staff with the concept of this project through in-depth study and clear understanding of the LFA, preparation of the roadmap and capacitate them to implement the components of the project effectively to achieve the expected result. The three day training module included input sessions,

group activities like discussions and report presentations. Group games, video clippings and interactive sessions made the training lively and effective. On the third day the training culminated with evaluation and group photographs.

Book-keeping Training for SHGs at Chandrapur: Two day training on book-keeping was organised on February 27 and 28, 2019, at Gobardhan village, Chandrapur. Ms. Kopila Marak, Training Coordinator of Mahila Shakti Kendra -Balipara, was the resource-person. There were 85 participants, including the office-bearers, and minimum of two members each from 15 SHGs attended the training programme. The training was intensive with input sessions combined with practical activities. The exercises were centred on maintaining the SHG books of records, minute books, attendance registers, saving ledger, loan ledger, cash book and individual passbook and general ledgers. In the evaluation after the two long days of training, the participants expressed that it had given them better understanding of SHG and that they are now confident of writing and maintaining the SHG books in proper order. The FAsCE India team facilitated the smooth conduct of the programme and thanked the resource person and participants for their presence, despite inclement weather.



Project Orientation and Staff Capacity Building Programme: The project "Integrated Sustainable Community Development (ISCD), through Formation and Strengthening of SHGs, for Improved Livelihood at Somanpara, in West Garo Hills" began its second phase from February 2019. A project orientation and staff capacity building programme was held at MSFS Provincialate, Narengi, from February 28 to March 02, 2019. The project core team members were trained by Ms Kopila Marak, Training Coordinator of MASK, Balipara, Ms Regina Sereng, Programme Coordinator and Ms Chaya Kalita, Women's Coordinator from FAsCE India. In the input sessions, Ms Kopila Marak dealt with the SHG functioning, grading of SHGs, internal lending in the SHGs, monitoring the record books, assisting to develop income generating activities for the groups in accordance with availability of resources, market and interest of groups. The practical sessions included presentation of group activities on internal lending, grading and facilitating addressing of social issues. The participants were also equipped by the resource person to assist the groups to establish linkage with Block Office and bank in order to avail the Government schemes on health, livelihood etc. for women and SHGs. On the third day, the Programme Coordinator oriented the project staff on the project concept and discussed at length the project's log frame. The participants were also briefed on their day-to-day activities of field visit, monitoring, monthly action plan and monthly activity report compilation and submission of these to the project head-office. The three day meeting concluded with a group photo and short valedictory meeting.



SHGs participate in POSHAN Mela at Somonpara: In the run-up to the International Women's Day celebration, the Gambegre Block of West Garo Hills, Meghalaya, organized POSHAN Mela, under the Ministry of Women and Child Development. It is to commemorate the first anniversary of POSHAN Abhiyan on March 8, by organising Poshan Mela across the country to raise awareness on nutrition for woman and child health. FAsCE India SHGs of Somonpara participated in the POSHAN Mela by putting up pickle and snacks stall. The members of SHGs prepared variety of pickle from gooseberry, jackfruit, tamarind and vegetables and healthy home-made snacks for sale in this mela. Again on March 20, the SHGs put up their stalls in the Haat Bazar in Gambegre. The groups prepared nutritional snacks, food items and pickle for the sale. This event which was organized at the Block was an occasion for exchanging knowledge, skills and nutritional facts & food among women collectively and individually from various villages.



PROMOTION OF CHILD RIGHTS THROUGH EDUCATION AND PARTICIPATION

Extending Educational Assistance to another 100 Children: FAsCE India firmly believes that most sustainable solution to the present day problems of the underprivileged lie in providing education to them or their children, in whom lie the destiny of the Society. Therefore, every year from the time of its inception onwards, FAsCE India extends educational assistance to less privileged and deserving students from every nook and corner of Northeast India. Through the contribution of many generous hearts, it has already helped hundreds of children to complete their education and a good number of students were financially assisted to complete their professional courses. This year FAsCE India, in collaboration with Light in Life Organization, Switzerland, has launched a project of providing another 100 more deserving children (50 children are assisted for their school fees and 50 children are helped with residential facilities) for their school education. FAsCE India deeply acknowledges with gratitude the generosity of the Light in Life Organization in promoting progress through the education of less privileged children.



Distribution of Jersey, Amlokhipait and Dekapam, Telam: On January 21, 2019, uniform T-Shirts were distributed to the children of FAsCE India Supplementary Education Centres at Dekapam and Amlokhi Pait



villages in Telam, Assam. 80 children from both the Supplementary Education Centres received their uniform T-Shirts. Mr Bijoy Doley, Coordinator of the centres, organised the distribution along with other volunteers and leaders. The children were very happy to receive the uniform jersey which indeed would instil in them a feeling of oneness as children of FAsCE India Supplementary Education Centre.

Art It Out and Who Am I: On March 16, 2019, the interns from TATA Institute of Social Sciences Guwahati, conducted some educational activities, namely 'ART IT OUT' AND 'WHO AM I' with the FAsCE India Supplementary Education Centre Bongaon. In 'ART IT OUT' the students were asked to sketch out their mother and father separately based on the daily activities done by the parents. This was done in order to assess the portrayal and perspective of the child towards his/her parents. In the 'Who AM I' activity, the students were asked to act different characters of the society such as police, doctor, boy, girl, teacher, etc and the remaining ones were asked to guess the characters based on acting. This was done to assess the student's vision and perspective of this character.



Children's Manifesto to Political Parties: On March 4, 2019, two students from FAsCE India Supplementary Education Centre, 12 years old Apsana Khatun and 13 years old Hafija Khatun, met with



politicians of five major political parties of Assam with four-paged agenda. This agenda was composed and signed by 20 children, boys and girls, hailing from different communities in Assam. The agenda presented to the politicians of the Congress, BJP as well as regional parties, Asom Gana Parishad (AGP), All India United Democratic Front (AIUDF) and Bodoland People's Front (BPF), is categorised into five areas of focus: health, nutrition, safety, education and sanitation and hygiene. While some demands are universal, such as better educational infrastructure in schools, the key

demands taken into account the regional complexities such as the annual floods etc. This was a collaborative initiative of FAsCE India with Adolescent and Children Rights Network, Assam (ACRNA) partnered with UNICEF.

Agenda Presentation in DD News: On March 31, 2019, National DD News televised the news on FAsCE India Supplementary Education Centre, Narengi, during the prime time news hour, from New Delhi. The DD News crew visited the Supplementary Education Centre at SFS Higher Secondary School, Narengi, to film the interview with the children on March 26, 2019. On March 29 the second interview was conducted by the national newspaper, Indian Express. 12 year old Apsana's request focused on increased safety for women and girls in Assam, "Why is it that girls are not allowed to venture out after dark?" And Hafija's main concern was education. The two study in local Assamese medium schools in Guwahati, and are often compelled to skip school during the monsoons, and the floods which come along with it every year. "Many times our school gets flooded too," says Hafija, "The drains overflow and there is no option for our teachers but to cancel classes".



EMPOWERMENT THROUGH CAPACITY BUILDING PROGRAMMES

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Training on Justice, Peace and Integrity of Creation: FAsCE India facilitated a training programme on Justice, Peace and Integrity of Creation for the members of the Social Apostolate and Innovative Ministries Forum of the MSFS North East India Province, on March 8, 2019, at MSFS Provincialate Guwahati. The Orientation Programme began with a prayer led by Fr John Barman, Director of Fransalian Youth Ministry. Fr Saji George, welcomed all the participants, especially Fr Agnelo Fernandes, the Resource Person of the day and former General Councilor for Social Apostolate and Innovative Ministries and Fr George Panthanmackel, Provincial of MSFS Northeast India Province and President of FAsCE India.



In the first session, Fr Agnelo explained what is justice and then highlighted the salient features of Justice. He also spoke about four types of justice: Distributive Justice, Procedural Justice, Retributive Justice, and Restorative Justice. In the second session, the resource person, focused on Peace and its implications. The former General Councilor suggested the Ways of Promoting Justice and Peace: Education for Justice and Peace of all, especially of Children; Recapturing our Value System that Promotes Justice, and Peace and Meaningful Approach to Pluralism. He also made the participants aware of the various schemes available for various categories of people and the importance of getting in touch with the people concerned and tapping these schemes for the deserved, especially for the least, marginalized, differently abled, visually challenged, widows, old people etc. The input sessions were also coupled with interactions and clarifications by the participants. The sessions ended with the vote of thanks proposed by Fr Anthony Barowa.

National Conference on Substance Use and Abuse at SFS College Aalo: On March 16, 2019 the Department of Sociology of Saint Francis De Sales College, Aalo, conducted its first ever National



Conference on the topic "Substance Use and abuse: Implications and Societal Response", in collaboration with FAsCE India, organized by Centre for Research. Eight papers were presented at the conference. There were three technical sessions: first technical session was the inauguration program and the other two technical sessions were for paper presentation. Dr Bino Thomas, Asst. Prof. Dept. of PSW, NIMHANS, was chairperson for the first technical session and Fr Dr Jose Karipadathu chaired the second technical session. The conference was graced by the presence of the Mother Vision Team, an NGO run by the

mothers of the Galo Community, which fights against the drug abusers. There were fruitful interactions between the students and resource personnel during the panel discussion. The Conference ended with a short valedictory function, followed by a group photo session. Hearty congratulations to Fr Thomas Edakishy and SFS College community at Aalo.

Capacitating Lay Leaders: FAsCE India, in collaboration with St. Francis De Sales Parish Church Chabua, organised four-days Seminar cum Workshop for the lay leaders of Upper Assam, from March 21-24, 2019, at SFS Parish, Chabua. The objective of the training programme was to engage the lay leaders more intently and



effectively in the development and transformation of the society . The resource persons were Most Rev. Albert Hemrom, Co-Adjutor Bishop, Dibrugarh Diocese, Fr. Milkius Tirkey, Parish Priest, Chabua, Fr. John Doley, Miao Diocese and Mr. Lawrence Minj, Former Head Catechist, Dhuria Parish. The resource persons dealt upon various relevant topics pertaining to family life, leadership, skill development which would facilitate them as effective leaders in the society. 58 leaders benefited from the seminar cum workshop. FAsCE India acknowledges its gratitude to Fr Milkius Tirkey and the Chabua community for effectively organizing the well conducted capacity building programmes.

INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY CELEBRATION

Chandrapur: At Chandrapur, International Women's Day was celebrated on March 9, 2019. The leaders of the women's group and self help groups took the initiative to organise the day. Around 250 women from Gobardhan village participated in the celebration. The day-long celebration began with Holy Mass at 09:00 AM, presided over by Rev. Fr Jose Thekkel MSFS, Rector of SFS Shrine, Narengi followed by fun-games and sports. To celebrate the unity, since the participants were from different socio-cultural backgrounds, they shared fellowship lunch. And the closing ceremony of the day-long event was a colourful cultural programme which was graced by Rev. Fr Jose Karipadathu MSFS, Principal, Don Bosco School, Chandrapur. In his speech, Fr Karipadathu congratulated the women for their unity and the initiatives taken by them for the upliftment of their community through various service-oriented activities as Self Help Groups. Mrs Leena Marak, the woman leader of Gobardhan, proposed the vote of thanks. She expressed her gratitude to the guests, invitees and the women participants for their whole-hearted support in making the celebration meaningful.



Narengi: On March 10, 2019, Women's Day celebration was organised at FAsCE India head-office premises in Narengi. Based on this year's theme, "Think Equal, Build Smart, Innovate for Change" the Women's Day celebration was combined with a campaign to create public awareness on Gender-based Violence. The occasion was graced by eminent personalities from Government departments and Non-Government sector. The Chief Guest was Dr. Sunita Changkakoti, Chairperson, Assam State Commission for Protection of Child Rights and renowned women's rights activist. Rev. Fr George Panthanmackal MSFS, Provincial of MSFS North East Province, graced the occasion as the Guest of Honour. And among the esteemed guests were Ms. Sewali Sharma, Secretary of Assam Centre for Rural Development, Mr Binod Kaman, Community Organiser [ASULM] under Guwahati Municipal Corporation and Panchayat leaders from Amsing Jorabat and Patharquary. The programme began at 10:00 am with a prayer dance by the children of FAsCE India Supplementary Centre, Narengi. Colourful traditional dance performances were put up by the women of the various SHGs. A skit on Domestic Violence was performed by the women of Self Help Groups from Geetamandir. The skit portrayed domestic violence in a family where elderly parents are mistreated by their children and other members of the family. Speaking on the occasion, the Chief Guest, Dr. Sunita Changkakoti, highly appreciated the efforts of FAsCE India in promoting women empowerment programme. She urged the women to respect one another and participate effectively in the group activities, both qualitatively and quantitatively, as it is important to have a good representation and active participation of women in the development of community. The Chief Guest also spoke about the various development schemes for women



like Kanaklata Mahila Sabalakaran Asoni which the SHGs can avail for further development of their livelihood activities. Fr Saji George, appreciated the SHG members for their achievements and efforts in building their groups and assured them of support for their upliftment. Award ceremony added meaning to the colourful celebration. Award for best SHG was given to Aklan SHG and best Village Organization award was given to Jai Jeevan Grayma Sangathan from Amsing Jorbat by Fr Provincial. Karbi dance by Aklan & Rashmi SHGs, Bodo dance by Ma Kali SHG and Nepali dance by Shristy & Maya Prity were adjudged first, second and third respectively for best cultural performance. The programme concluded with vote of thanks and distribution of refreshments.

Somonpara: On March 21, 2019, FAsCE India SHGs, at Somonpara, celebrated Women's Day. At the outset of the celebration, Mr Albert Sangma, Community Mobilizer, welcomed and felicitated traditionally Mr Balsim R. Marak, the Chief Guest and Fr John Kelamkuzhackal, the Guest of Honour and Local Director of FAsCE India, with head-gear, necklace piece and bouquet of flowers. Fr John, in his welcome address highlighted the importance of the day and the significant role the women play in their family and society. Encouraging the women, he said that they have the ability to contribute to the upliftment of society. Colours of life: On March 19, 2019, an Event on pot painting was organized by the interns of TISS, Guwahati on the occasion of Pre-Holi celebration, at FAsCE India Supplementary Education Centre Narengi.
