The new house consisted of 2 bedroom, 1 kitchen and 1 toilet. The family members expressed their heartfelt gratitude for the generosity and humanitarian service of FAsCE India.









PROMOTION OF CHILD RIGHTS

Inauguration of Supplementary Education Centre at Gobardhan: The project envisions an all-round development of the underprivileged children. Under the thrust area of Child Rights and

Empowerment of Children, a new Supplementary Education Centre was inaugurated at Gobardhan Village, Chandrapur on 26th February 2022. The new centre will provide non-formal classes and conduct co-curricular activities. The occasion was graced by Fr Saji George, General Secretary for Formation, Fr Antony Kattathara, Executive Director, FAsCE India and Fr Maniyar Aruputham Arokia Swamy, Principal, Don Bosco School, Chandrapur. Fr Saji addressed the participants and emphasised the importance of tuition class. He mentioned that the







students from the community should make use of this facility to the maximum. Fr Arokia Swamy in his speech reiterated that the students are very fortunate for having supplementary classes as there were no such facilities during his school days. The programme ended successfully with some light refreshments for all the participants.



Life Skill Programme at Supplementary Education Centre: To equip the children with social and life skills, FAsCE India introduced Life Skill Programme at supplementary education centre. Mrs Mousumi Saikia Kalita, an entrepreneur, trained the student to cook fast food items and other snacks. It is an essential life skill to be independent and confident. This skill will also help the children to engage in fund raising activities for community or voluntary works. Another activity carried out by the resource person is colour personality test. In this activity, the students were asked to choose their favourite colour. Based on their colour choice, the student's personality traits were interpreted. This exercise is helpful in self-reflection and self-disclosure





AWARENESS PROGRAMME ON PREVENTION OF COVID-19

An awareness programme on Prevention of Covid-19 was organized by FAsCE India in collaboration with Regional Research Institute of Homeopathy under Central Council of Research in Homeopathy, Ministry of AYUSH on 16th February 2022 at Ekrabari and Hathisila. The objective of the programme was to spread awareness on preventive methods especially the non-vaccinated individuals. During the occasion, Arsenic Album-30, Homeopathic Immunity Booster and leaflets were distributed to the participants to boost their immune system and combat Covid-19. More than 300 people participated in the programme and various preventive measures were discussed.







WOMEN EMPOWERMENT AND CAPACITY BUILDING

Formation of 10 new SHGs at Geetamandir: 10 new SHGs were formed in Geetamandir and orientation was given on 21st February 2022. Fr Saji George, General Secretary for Formation and FAsCE India team was part of the major event. Fr Saji George spoke on the importance of forming SHGs and highlighted the benefits of becoming SHG member. The SHGs were advised to follow the Panchasutra: five principles of SHG, sincerely in order to be a successful group. One of the key principle is maintaining books of records, a factor responsible for success or failure of SHGs. The SHGs were also encouraged to form more groups in order to help each other and receive financial assistance from the Government. The newly formed groups were excited and at the same time there were lots of doubt on their face. FAsCE India team informed and assured the group that they will be provided with training and handholding from time to time. The SHGs were instructed to register themselves in Government programs like NULM to get maximum benefit from welfare schemes.





Strengthening of 25 SHGs at Gobardhan, Chandrapur: A one day capacity building and strengthening programme was conducted on 29th March 2022 at Gobardhan Grant village. The objective of the programme was to build the capacity of SHGs and improve their skills. Team building activities were conducted to strengthen the members and groups. Miss Chaya Kalita, Programme Coordinator, FAsCE India took a daylong session to explain the concepts and functioning of SHGs. Various topics on Organizational Management and Financial Management were discussed in the training programme. At the end of the programme, there was Question & Answer and feedback session. The programme coordinator assured the groups with all necessary help from the organization.





Workshop on Women Issues at Geeta Mandir: To create awareness among women, "Workshop on Women Issues" was organized on 31st March, 2022 at Geeta Mandir. Mrs. Mousmi Saikia Kalita, resource

person spoke on fundamental rights of women at length and encouraged women to be alert and proactive. The resource person discussed about gender discrimination and gender equality which is a burning issue worldwide. Fortunately, positive changes are taking place in India. The policy makers are focusing in gender centric decisions in all programs and policies. The event was a grand success and more than 200 women and children participated in the workshop.



NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL DAYS

Republic Day Celebration: Republic Day was celebrated at various places on 26th January 2022 to commemorate the day the Constitution of India came into effect. Students, local leaders and communities participated in the event.

Amsing Jorabat: To mark the event, Indian national flag was hoisted at Anganwadi Centres and L.P. School. Local leaders, village head, panchayat members and SHG members participated in the event and paid homage to the freedom fighters by singing the National Anthem. The staff of FAsCE India spoke on the importance of Republic Day and the duties of the citizens.





Ekrabari: The Republic Day was observed in FAsCE Supplementary Education Centre, Ekrabari by the students and community leaders. The National Flag was hoisted on the occasion and more than 100 people participated in the event. The students along with the other participants sang National Anthem to observe the historic day.





Geetamandir: The SHG members along with community member organized Republic Day on 26th January 2022 at Geetamandir. The students from Narengi Supplementary Education Centre performed patriotic dances and entertained the participants. The director mentioned that the Constitution of India came into effect on this day and celebrating this event is a reminder to all the citizens to respect and honour the Indian Constitution. The community leaders gave a meaningful speech and urged everyone to be a responsible and informed citizen.





World Cancer Day

The children of FAsCE India Supplementary Centre, Narengi enacted street play themed "Close the Care Gap". More than 200 communities including children, SHG members, teachers and village leaders participated in the event.

The FAsCE India team organized a cleanliness drive on the occasion of World Social Work Day on 15th March 2022 at Ekrabari area. Keeping in mind the World Social Work Day theme "Co-building a New Eco-Social World: Leaving No One Behind", the children from the FAsCE Supplementary Education centre, Narengi and Ekrabari participated in the event to convey a meaningful message to the community and surroundings. The participation of every citizen in bringing about social changes by safeguarding the environment is the need of the hour. The cleanliness drive was carried out in the Supplementary Education Centre, Ekrabari and Ekrabari main road.





National Girl Child Day & International Day of Education

On 24th January, 2022, the project office had two events together to mark the significance of the National Girl Child Day and International Day of Education in its Supplementary Education Centres. The National Girl Child Day is celebrated in India every year on this day to spread awareness about inequalities faced by girls in the country; promote awareness about the rights of girl children and increase awareness on female education, health and nutrition.

The International Day of Education was marked with a particular focus on spreading the importance of education and lifelong opportunities for better life. The teachers animated the session through various games and activities to help them learn the importance of the day in a befitting manner.





INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY CELEBRATION

FAsCE India celebrated International Women's day on 8th March 2022 as a mark of respect and appreciation to all the women. The event was organized with special focus on the theme "Gender equality today for a sustainable tomorrow" at Gobardhan Chandrapur, Manikbond and Narengi.

Chandrapur: The programme began with a prayer and welcome address by Miss Chaya Kalita, Programme Coordinator, FAsCE India. The occasion was graced by Rev. Fr Stephen J, General Secretary, Social Apostolate & Innovative Ministries as chief guest, Rev Fr Saji George, General Secretary for Formation and Fr Antony Kattathara, Executive Director, FAsCE India. He appreciated the vibrant activities of SHGs and encouraged them to engage in productive livelihood options. The guest of honour, Mr. Rinku Haloi, Block Project Manager (BPM), ASRLM, Chandrapur Block also addressed the participants and spoke on gender equality for sustainable future. women in every spheres of life to bring about a balanced society. The BPM appreciated FAsCE India for organising the programme meaningfully.









EVALUATION AND MONITORING VISIT

Review Meeting at Manikbond

Fr Antony Kattathara, Executive Director, FAsCE India, Fr Saji George, General Secretary for Formation, and Miss Chaya Kalita, Program Coordinator visited Manikbond for review meeting on 3rd and 4th March 2022. The progress of SHGs and Supplementary Education Centres were discussed during the meeting. The SHG leaders shared their problems and sought help from the organization.









Interaction with SHGs

FAsCE India head office team paid a visit to SHGs of Manikbond and had interaction session. The SHGs shared about their experiences as a group and highlighted their needs for loans to meet the demand of the group members. The team assured the SHG with financial assistance if they function well with consistency. The books of records and other documents were checked and it was found to be well maintained.





Tailoring & Knitting Centre

The tailoring and knitting centre have been functioning well, providing livelihood opportunities to many underprivileged women. Young girls and women are now hopeful to start something on their own after completing the courses. Fr Saji George, General Secretary for Formation and FAsCE India head office team met the trainees and applauded their effort and enthusiasm. The trainees were informed on various career opportunities and scope in the field of tailoring and knitting.





Monitoring Visit to FAsCE Supplementary Education Centres

Sampathar: The staff of FAsCE India paid a visit to Supplementary Education Centre, Sampathar on 12th February 2022 as part of monitoring activity. Due to the poor communication facilities, the people do not have access to education and livelihood programmes. To motivate the children, co-curricular activities were conducted and the children were encouraged to attend the supplementary education programme. Arsenic Album-30, Immunity Booster, was distributed to the villagers to boost their health thereby preventing Covid-19 infection.





Manikbond: During the monitoring visit, FAsCE India team interacted with the teachers and students of the Supplementary Centre at Manikbond. The team visited the centre to assess the status of the supplementary centre and to encourage the children to attend the free classes. The centre was provided with study materials and sports items to enhance the learning experience and boost physical health at the same time.





Ekrabari: To take stock of the overall progress and functioning, the staff of FAsCE India visited FAsCE Supplementary Education Centre, Ekrabari on 10th February 2022. The teacher was advised to maintain proper record of the students. Useful tools like educational charts and display posters were distributed to enhance the classroom learning.





Chandrapur: A monitoring visit to FAsCE Supplementary Education Centre, Chandrapur was carried out by FAsCE India team to review the progress. The students from Narengi Supplementary Education Centre participated and interacted with the children of the centre. Around 50 students attends the centre regularly.





Sualiluka: On 12th February 2022, FAsCE India team visited Sualiluka to evaluate the functioning of the Supplementary Education Centre. The children were encouraged and motivated to come and learn in the centre regularly.
