COVID CARE 2021

100 Episode of COVID Care 2021 @FAsCEIndia

COVID Care 2021 @ FAsCE is a project initiated by the Fransalian Agency for Social Care and Education in collaboration with MSFS Guwahati Province to fight against the second wave of Covid 19 pandemic and to reach out to the affected people. This project aims to bring solace to the people in need, especially the vulnerable and underprivileged sections of the society affected by the pandemic, by reaching out with immunity booster kits, dry rations, medicines for patients, preventive medicines for vulnerable people etc. Besides, helpline desks were set up at various centres with the motto "get vaccinated" and initiated awareness campaigns and sanitization drives.



On the 100th Episode of the Covid Care Service on 24.08.2021 at 10th Mile Amsing Jorabat area Shri Debojit Mahanta, Prosecuting Inspector of Kamrup Metro graced the occasion as the Chief Guest and initiated the distribution of relief packets to 110 needy families in the presence of Dr Sabu Francis, Provincial of MSFS Guwahati Province. Dr Saji George, Director of FAsCE India appreciated the tireless efforts and hard work of all collaborators, volunteers and staff in reaching out to the affected people.



Survival Kit with Dry Ration to Vulnerable People

As part of the COVID Care 2021, the FAsCE India team distributed survival kits consisting of dry rations to the sick, senior citizens, single mothers, differently-abled persons and rickshaw personnel as an immediate response to mitigate their hardship in different localities.



Distribution of Immunity Booster Kit

Boosting our immune system and appropriate hygiene practices are key measures that individuals can take to fight against this pandemic. FAsCE India continued its journey of distributing immunity booster kits to vulnerable people, especially children at various localities and places: Amsing Jorabat, Geetamandir etc. We have reached out to another 500 needy and poor families with immunity booster kits that have health drinks, vitamin c tablets, N 97 masks, sanitiser, menthol for hot steam inhalation and soaps for hygiene.



Oxygen Concentrators

One of the ways to fight against the COVID 19-second wave was by equipping and strengthening the health facilitation centres with sufficient oxygen through oxygen concentrators as dropping oxygen levels is one of the consequences of COVID 19. FAsCE India made an earnest effort to make available oxygen concentrators in different centres to strengthen the health system. Oxygen concentrators were made available at Bahalpur, Assam and Umwhalang, Meghalaya. Through the medium of the oxygen concentrators, we could save the lives of patients with low oxygen counts.

Covid Relief at Mawynrenking, Meghalaya

FAsCE India facilitated the distribution of relief material namely Survival kit to the 72 families of Mawynrenking, Meghalaya on July 10, 2021. The second wave of COVID-19 has proven to be not only a health crisis but also a livelihood crisis affecting vulnerable households with worsening food insecurity.



Relief Service at Galsi, West Bengal

FAsCE India extended its relief service to Galsi, West Bengal. Survival kits were distributed to sick persons, single mothers, senior citizens and needy families on July 30, 2021. SFS community, Galsi facilitated the distribution of relief.



COVIDCare at Bahalpur

On July 29, 2021, FAsCE India in collaboration with the SFS Community at Bahalpur, the facilitated distribution of Survival Kits containing dry rations to sick persons and senior citizens of 30 needy families and we also distributed Immunity Booster Kits to children from the tea garden.



Relief Service at Panishali

The community at Panishali once again expressed its solidarity with the poor and needy by reaching out to 250 families with essential food items. The survival kit brought a lot of relief and renewed hope in the lives of the people as many of them could not secure the necessities of life.



Gadgets for Online Classes

To ensure uninterrupted learning and equal participation in the online classroom, FAsCE India provided gadgets and internet packages to needy children for online classes during the COVID-19 lockdown this year.



LIVELIHOOD PROMOTION DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

Distribution of Livelihood Support 10 SHGs

FAsCE India on September 27, 2021, distributed livelihood support to SHGs of Amsing Jorabat. These SHGs facilitated by FAsCE India are active groups engaged in community development activities and income-generating activities as well. During the distribution ceremony Fr. Saji George, Executive Director of FAsCE India handed over the livelihood support cheque to the deserving 10 SHGs to ramp up their income-generating activities.



Inauguration of Muri Factory

A cottage industry business venture was taken up by Mrs Deepali Murari, a woman leader of Amsing Jorabat. She is the President of the village organisation and an active SHG member. With the zeal of earning and supporting her family



financially especially in this challenging time, Mrs Dipali Murari with two more persons in her team bought a Muri making factory at 10th Mile with small capital investment. The factory was inaugurated on September 06, 2021, by Fr. Saji George, Executive Director of FAsCE India. It is indeed a way forward for many of her counterparts to take up small scale livelihood activities.



Livelihood Business During the time of Covid-19

The impact of the pandemic had devastating effects on SHGs and their livelihood activities due to disruption in the supply chain and job loss of male members in their families. The women of Geetamandir SHGs took an innovative idea to revive their household and group income. They had started making traditional, nutritious snacks and selling them in their locality. Some of the groups have put up stalls to sell their products. The hygienically prepared nutritious traditional snacks are gradually gaining market and income for the Geetamandir SHGs.



PROMOTION OF HEALTH

Preventive Medicines to 10,000 Beneficiaries under 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav

FAsCE India in collaboration with the Regional Research Institute of Homoeopathy (RRIH), under Central Council of Research in Homoeopathy, Ministry of AYUSH distributed Arsenic Album 30 to 10000 beneficiaries, as mass prophylaxis as a part of 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav' under India @ 75, as per the Standard Operating Procedures given by the Ministry of AYUSH from August 30 to September 5, 2021. Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav is a series of events being organized by the government to commemorate the 75th Anniversary of India's independence. The project locations were Guwahati, Telam, Bahalpur, Manikbond in Assam and Somapara in Meghalaya.



Awareness Programme on Prevention of COVID-19 by Ayush Team

As a part of this National Campaign, the Regional Research Institute of Homoeopathy (RRIH), under the Central Council of Research in Homoeopathy, Ministry of AYUSH, partnering with FASCE India conducted Health awareness programmes in Amsing Jorbat and Geetamandir. Dr Liyi Karso, Nodal officer and the team reached out to the general population, with a special focus on the geriatric people, with preventive health messages, talks on healthy diet and lifestyle and distributed preventive medicines and leaflets with instructions for daily healthy living. The beneficiaries made use of the time through active interaction, questions and clarifications.



Ayush 64 to COVID Patients

The impact of the second wave of the COVID-19 pandemic has been severe in Assam, more so in the Kamrup Metro district with a higher caseload in this quarter of the year. FASCE India in collaboration with the Regional Research Institute of Homoeopathy, Guwahati continued the distribution of AYUSH 64 medicines in asymptomatic and mild to moderate Covid-19 patients in home isolation and Arsenic Album 30 for mass prophylaxis as per the Standard Operating Procedure given by the Ministry of AYUSH. The effort was highly appreciated by the beneficiaries, as it was difficult for many to access the medicines.



Health Awareness Programme

Bahalpur: During this time of pandemic one key challenge is to ensure prevention, good health practices and adequate hygiene. A community-level health awareness programme was conducted to equip people with information on prevention and healthy practices. On July 29, 2021 awareness programme was held at Bahalpur in the Dhubri district of Assam. Mr Wahid, the resource person, enlightened the people of the tea garden community about the basic health tips. He encouraged people to frequently wash their hands, eat healthy food, observe physical distance and avoid crowded places.



Gobardhan: On September 09, 2021 awareness programme on the prevention of COVID-19 was held at Bongaon and Gobardhan village. Miss Chaya Kalita, the resource person emphasized self-care guidelines for preventive health measures and immunity-boosting food and medications.



FLOOD RELIEF AT KOILAMOILA

This year, the Chirang district of Assam was badly hit by a flood that affected the lives of the people, damaged agricultural land, crops and river embankments. Displaced people took shelter in relief camps. FAsCE India facilitated the distribution of relief materials in collaboration with St. Peter Parish to 102 flood-affected families in Koilamoila village, Chirang district. 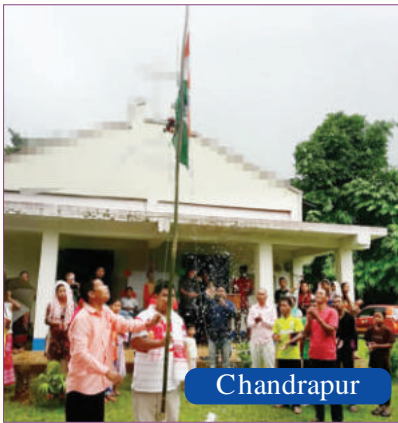
